

MALHEUR COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

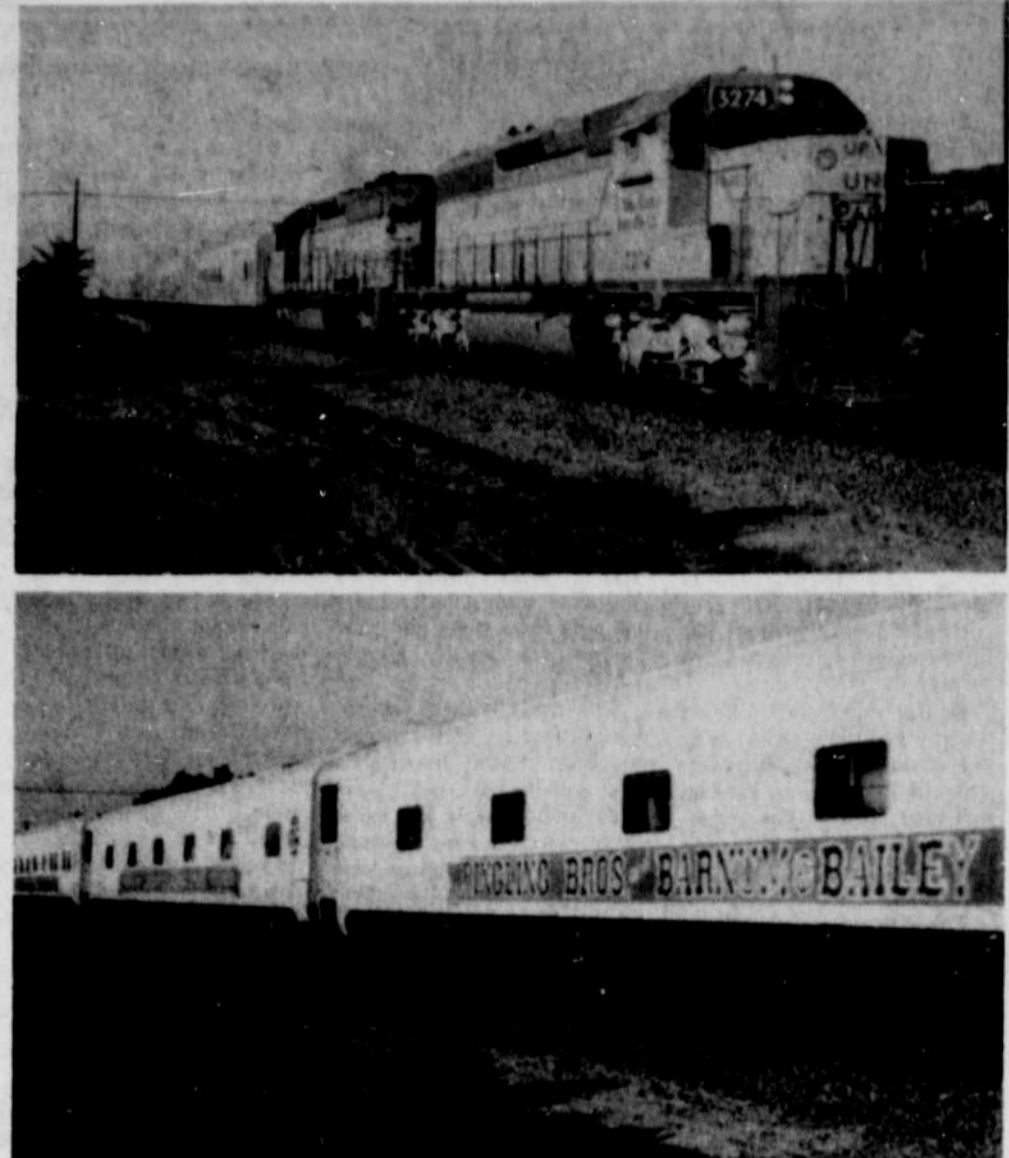
Minutes of the Malheur County Court Meeting - July 3, 1974:
 Court met with Judge Roy Hirai presiding and Commissioners E.W. Maag and Sam Hartley present.
 Approved by Motion to pay \$10,500.00 to the state for partial payment for the construction of the Foothill Drive Bridge.
 Court was informed that the revenue from the forest funds would be \$1,681.00.
 Court approved liquor license for The Oasis at Juntura.
 Approved by Motion to pay the bill from Idaho Camera Company of \$470.20, for exchange of video equipment for the Extension Service.
 Hales Sheet Metal of Ontario submitted a bid of \$10,246.00 on a 16½ ton air conditioner for the jail and \$9,046.00 on a 15 ton machine.
 Drake Plumbing in Boise had submitted a bid of \$7,966.00 to install the air conditioner.

 Approved by Motion to accept the lease offered by Union Oil Company for geothermal exploration.
 Mr. Atkins presented the Court with a preliminary lease on the new clinic building.
 Approved by Motion that the County refund taxes to Paul Baker in the amount of \$95.13 for double payment, and to Hideo Harada in the amount of \$26.08 for over assessment.
 Approved by Motion to accept the Honeywell contract on maintenance of the thermostat controls for the Courthouse in the amount of \$1,452.00.
 Court to meet with Pacific Light & Power Co. regarding a transmission line through Malheur County, on July 24th at 10:00 A.M.
 Approved by Motion that the County purchase three dimensional, raised Malheur County maps from Pasadena Map Co. for \$59.70.
 Approved by Motion to pay county bills due the end of the fiscal year in the amount of \$261,147.95 and July bills in the amount of \$75,020.65.
