Mr. and Mrs. Jim Striker are doing some work on the Rex Nichols tenant house in preparation to moving into it soon.

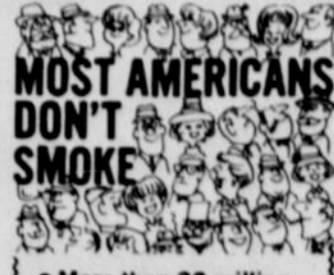
Mrs. Laura Bale attended the winter concert at the Parma High School Thursday evening. Her granddaughter Lee Bale is in the band.
