Hunting Season Opening Dates

Opening dates for major 1975 hunting seasons were adopted by the Oregon Wildlife Commission last Friday in Portland. About 30 representatives of public agencies, sportsmen's groups, and interested citizens were present at the public hearing with recommendations concerning one or more of the seasons.

The general deer season will open on October 4. Rocky mountain elk will become legal game on November 1 and the season for Roosevelt elk will open on November 15. August 16 was selected as the opening date for pronghorn antelope and tie early archery seasons will open this year on August 23.

Chukar season was set to open concurrent with the deer season on October 4. The only other season for upland birds, for ring-necked pheasants, was set to open October 18.

The opening date of the Rocky Mountain elk season was the item of major concern for many of the members of the public who came to testify before the Commission.

The hearing for setting lengths, bag limits, and other details of big game seasons will be held May 31.

Other hay amounted to sales of \$2,224,000; corn silage shows receipts of \$1,078,000.

Peppermint and spearmint crop acreages, as well as sales show increases. Sales amounted to \$1,786,000 compared to \$829,000 last year.

Hop acreages declined over last year as well as gross income figures which show sales of \$162,000.

Vegetable and flower seed production shows significant growth, according to Novotny with 1974 sales of \$1,500,000.

While Malheur County is not a large producer of fruit crops sales amounted to \$205,500 for the year.

Sweet corn for the fresh and processed business amounted to some \$1,537,000 for 1974 and \$1,308,000 for 1973.

Specialty horticultural and truck crops amounted to \$161,000 for the year.

The beef cattle industry faced one of the most dramatic and disastrous economic adjustments recorded in 1974 with gross income figures \$6,998,000 less than in 1973.

The dairy business even though hard pressed by increased production costs according to Novotny registered sales of \$5,821,000 in 1974 compared to \$4,321,000 in 1973.
