Area PTA's To Sponsor "Seven Alone" As Fund Raiser

Nearly 50 years ago, in 1926, Honore Morrow wrote a book, titled "On to Oregon." The book was based on the gripping true story of seven young children left alone to face the hardships and dangers of crossing frontier America in the 1840's after the deaths of their parents.

Today, an adaptation of that book has been produced as a heartwarming movie, which will open in Ontario Centre Theatre on January 29 and will be sponsored as a fund-raising project by area PTA's.

The movie, "Seven Alone," which was filmed entirely in western Wyoming near the historic Oregon Trail, has been playing to sell-out crowds since it premiered in Salt Lake City on December 20. After premiering, the movie moved into 54 theaters during the Christmas holiday season. More than 200,000 persons saw the movie during the first 12 days.

Stewart H. Beveridge, Salt Lake City, in charge of marketing and distribution of the G-rated, family movie,

said coupons are available to movie-goers which will enable PTA's to receive a financial reimbursement. He said coupons are available at participating PTA's in the Treasure Valley.

For every coupon redeemed at the box office during the movies run in area theaters, the PTA's will receive 25c per paid admission, reimbursement to use in carrying out their own programs, explained Beveridge.

The coupons can be used not only by students, but also by their families. Participation in the PTA fund-raising project, continued Beveridge will have a three-prong effect: —it will enable PTA's to raise much-needed funds. —it will give families an opportunity to enjoy a wholesome, clean, family-oriented movie together. —it will be an educational experience since the movie is based on the true story of the Henry Sager family who left their Missouri home in 1843, bound for the "black soil of Oregon."
