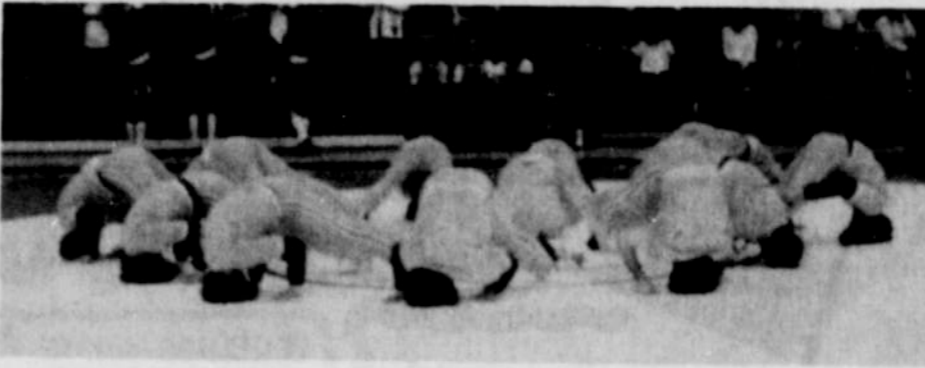
## Journal Classifieds Bring Results!

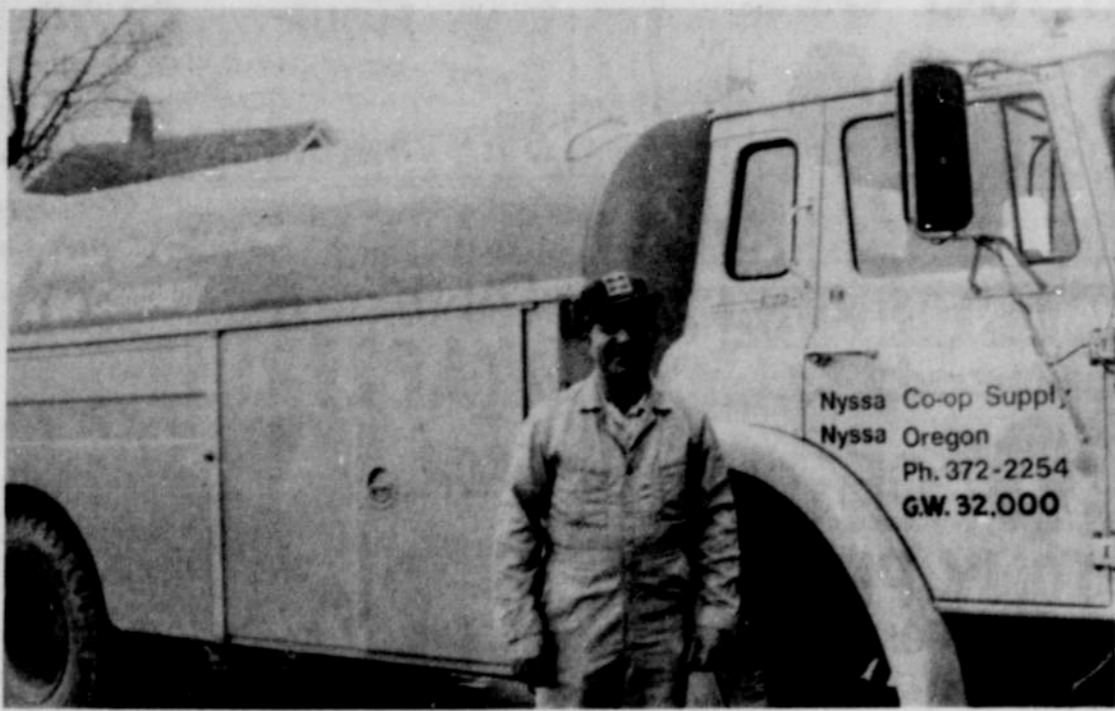
