# Numbers Up In Oregon

Ducks and geese wintering in Oregon are up substantially from recent years. according to results of the annual winter waterfowl survey conducted recently by state and federal wildlife biologists.

The nationwide survey was conducted during the second and third week in January and included all major waterfowl areas in the United States. Forty biologists from the Oregon Wildlife Commission and from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service participated in counting waterfowl throughout Oregon. Some 404,000 ducks were

recorded this year, an increase of nearly 54 percent from last year and up 12 percent over the average for the past five years. Geese were even more

prevalent this year. Double the number counted last vear-some 94,500- were observed, which is nearly 75 percent higher than the five-year average.
