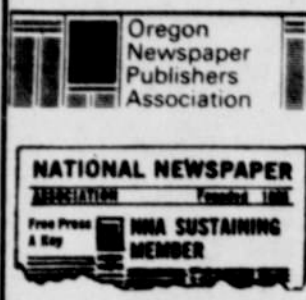

## TVCC Officials Thanked

One of the after effects of our school fire is the fact that a great many Nyssa people have become acquainted with Treasure Valley Community College.

Basketball and wrestling fans have packed the large TVCC gym on several occasions during the season, and the squads have used these facilities for practice. On two occasions the Nyssa team played the first half of a double header, so we had an opportunity to see the college team in action.

Not known to everyone is the fact that TVCC officials have offered these facilities to our school district at absolutely no cost. President Bud Skinner was on the phone almost immediately after he heard about the school fire, offering their assistance and help in any way possible. This generosity on the part of the college administration and staff should not go unnoticed. They have worked their schedules around to accommodate our teams and schedules, many times at their inconvenience.

Ten years is too long before we recognize a neighbor and friend, but sometimes it takes a catastrophe to accomplish this. Ironically, we are TVCC just as much as those in Ontario, Vale, and Huntington. It is easy to say their college, but more realistically it is our college.

In the meantime thousands have completed their formal education at TVCC, others have gone on to higher education. Many more have learned another language or skill, part of the community college concept of some learning for everyone. Eighteen year-olds just out of high school are only a small part of this program, which includes thirteen similar institutions accommodating 60,000 or more students throughout Oregon.

As the costs of higher education increase, and as the facilities at our four-year colleges and universities become more crowded, the community college will become increasingly more important in the plans of our high school graduates.

TVCC has progressed through the growing pains to what is now a solid institution. Enrollments have leveled off, the financial problems have eased, and college officials can plan with some degree of stability.

We would hope that patrons of the Nyssa school district can take the time to thank President Skinner and TVCC officials for their generosity during our time of need. Unfortunately, this need will extend through one more school year, and we would like to extend our thanks for this help.

## Nyssa Women Go Thru Clinic

The Breast Cancer Detection Center in Boise will examine 10,000 women patients over a period of five years with women coming from a large area in Ore. and Idaho. The center is funded by the American Cancer Society and the National Cancer Institute and these examinations are free of charge.

Mrs. Willis (Eris) Bertram, Nyssa area volunteer reports appointment times for Nyssa women are all filled and she cannot accept any more applications. Any cancellations will be filled from

her waiting list.

Mrs. Bertram stated that 93 Nyssa women will have had the privilege of going through the clinic since it opened in the fall of 1973. Sandra Morrison has helped with the interviewing.

Women who won't have the opportunity to go through the clinic and have any apprehension are advised to contact their doctor. The same type of breast examination is available at St. Luke's Hospital and St. Alphonsus Hospital in Boise, on a paying basis.

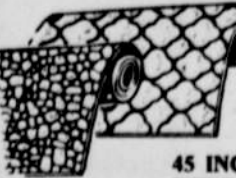
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
