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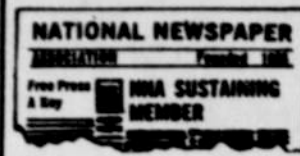
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A FRESH START

Christian Science Lecture Scheduled Next Week

"Ageless Youth" is the topic of a free public lecture on Christian Science in Ontario next week.

A Christian Science lecturer from Seattle, Wash., David C. Driver, C.S.B., will speak at 8:15 Friday evening, March 28 in the TVCC Administration Building under the auspices of Ontario Christian Science Society.

"When you know that youth and maturity are mental and spiritual qualities," Mr. Driver will say, "you will find you can't lose them to the past nor do you have to wait for them to appear in the future. You find them no longer confined to

just limited periods of your life but belonging to you all the time."

Mrs. Audrey Burroughs of Adrian will introduce Mr. Driver. Local arrangements for the lecture are being coordinated by Mrs. Bette Hopper of Fruitland and Pat Bond of Vale.

Mr. Driver, a native of New Zealand, holds a degree in architecture from the University of Auckland.

Before entering the public practice of Christian Science in 1964, he worked as an architect and planning consultant for many years.

In 1970 he became a teacher of Christian Science. He is currently on an extensive speaking tour as a member of The Christian Science Board of Lectureship.

Memorial Lectureships

Senator Frank Church spoke on "Community's Responsibility to the Aging," last Sunday in the Tuttle House of St. Michael's Episcopal Cathedral in Boise. His talk is the first of a series of E. Britt Nedry Memorial Lectureships.

Nedry, a lifetime Episcopalian, published the Kootenai County Leader at Coeur d'Alene, Idaho from 1946-1950 and then served as Idaho State Director of Occupational Licenses under the then-Governor Len Jordan. He was secretary to the Senate in the Idaho Legislature for two sessions. He published the Payette Lakes Star and the Cascade News at McCall until he retired in 1958. He was a long-time lay worker and volunteer at St. Michael's.

He died September 7 of last year and his wife, Elizabeth, resides in Boise.

Easter Services

St. Paul's Episcopal Church has scheduled the following services during Holy Week in preparation for Easter, beginning this Sunday:

Palm Sunday - The 11 a.m. Liturgy for Palm Sunday begins with the Blessing of the Palms and Procession, followed by the reading of the Passion Gospel, and continues with the Eucharist. Father Warren Sapp will be the celebrant.

Maundy Thursday - The Lord's Supper will be held at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 27, in observance of the institution of the Eucharist.

Good Friday - Community Observance at the Nazarene Church at 7:30 p.m., March 28.

Easter Eve - St. Paul's will join St. Matthew's, Ontario, on Saturday, March 29, at 9:30 p.m. for the Lighting of the Pascal Candle(s), the Easter Vigil, and Holy Baptism.

Easter Eve closes the long pre-Easter Season we know as Lent and Holy Week. Lent is an outgrowth of early Christianity's practice of having candidates for Holy Baptism undergo a long period of instruction and testing before they were baptized the night before Easter. Thru their baptism, they were then able to join all the faithful in the joyous greeting of the Day of Resurrection, partake of the Holy Eucharist, and a full welcome into the Body of Christ.

Today, we baptize persons at any season. But in keeping with the special significance of Easter Eve, St. Paul's has scheduled baptisms as part of our Easter Eve celebrations to be held with St. Matthew's,

Ontario, on Saturday, March 29, at 9:30 p.m.
