**PTA Seminar On Alcoholism**

Mrs. Dee J. Garner, OCPT Region 8 vice president, joined with about forty other students and PTA members to consider alternatives to alcoholism in a seminar at Menucha Camp Grounds, Corbett, Oregon, on Thursday and Friday, February 20-21.

Norm Southerby, a national alcoholism consultant from Long Beach, California, led a discussion about identification of youth problems with alcohol since 1970. The group participated in an evaluation of a recent TV movie on NBC called "Sarah T. - Portrait of a Teenage Alcoholic." Southerby called attention to the recent Oregon Governor's Commission on Youth Report on the current use of alcohol and other drugs, and stated that it verified current national trends.

Other speakers included Bill Allured, counselor from the Contact Center, Portland; Thomas P. Sullivan, Ph. D., executive secretary, Governor's Commission on Youth; Jim D. Duncan, consultant, Oregon Alcoholism and Health Association, Portland; and Andrew Hanners, executive director, Oregon Council on Alcohol Problems.

**Favorite Recipes**

**Cornmeal Dish**

Imagine something tasting halfway between cornbread and a cheese souffle and you'll get the idea of how delicious this oven dish is going to taste. It comes out with a pretty golden puffed crown which sinks fast as souffles are wont to do. For a main course accompany it with corned beef or ham, a hot green vegetable and cole slaw.

**Cornmeal Cheese Puff**

1/4 cups milk  
1/2 cup cornmeal  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon marjoram  
1/4 teaspoon dill weed  
1/4 teaspoon baking powder  
2 eggs, separated  
1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese  
Butter  
Grated parmesan cheese  
Heat 1/2 cup milk in saucepan until scalded. Mix cornmeal, salt, marjoram, sage and remaining 1/2 cup milk. Stir into hot milk and cook, stirring, until mixture comes to boil. Let it bubble gently 1 minute, stirring all the while. Mix in egg yolks. Mix in baking powder, cheddar cheese and 2 tablespoons butter, stirring until butter is melted. Whip egg whites until stiff. Fold into cornmeal mixture. Turn into buttered 1-quart baking dish. Bake in 375 deg. oven 30 to 35 minutes or until puffed and golden brown. Serve promptly (before it falls) with butter and grated parmesan cheese on top. Makes 4 servings.
