Sam Hartley and Chris Lords traveled to Fresno, Calif. last Thursday to compete in the United States Wrestling Federation National Junior Championship Western Division over the weekend.

There were approximately 400 wrestlers competing in the freestyle tournament. Each boy had to place in their State Tournament to be invited to this tournament.

Sam was wrestling in the 105 lbs. weight class. Friday was the first day of the tournament and his first match was against Cordova of Utah and Sam pinned him in the second round; his second match was against Gerding of Oregon, who he decided 9 to 1. Sam's third match was against Randy Wollen, Washington, he pinned Sam in the second.

Wollen is the Washington State Champ and the Canadian National Champion. He went on to win this tournament.

Saturday, Sam decided Roos of California 10-6; pinned in 3rd. Laska of California and decided Hollingsworth of Idaho 6-1.

Then he went into a round robin and Sam decided Hill of Oregon 11-1 and as he'd already wrestled Wollen he didn't have to again so Wollen won 1st. Sam 2nd., Hill 3rd and Hollingsworth 4th.

Chris Lords began wrestling Friday but ran into a tough match right at the start and was pinned by Hunter of Utah in the first although Chris was ahead 8-6 at the time. In Chris' second match he decided Johnson of California 10-7; Jake of California 13 to 0 and Loper of Oregon 19-2.

Saturday Chris wrestled Jones of Oregon and decided him 13-7 then he wrestled Bliss of Washington and was pinned. Bliss went on to win the tournament in this weight.

Chris garnered 11th place in this tournament. Sam Hartley and Chris Lords will fly to Simon Fraser University near Vancouver British Columbia on Thursday (today) to compete in the Canadian National Tournament this weekend.

No Dogs Allowed Afield During Nesting Period

Hunting dog owners are reminded that it is illegal to run or train dogs on land or water that is productive wildlife nesting habitat during the four-month period which begins April 1 and extends through July.

The regulation is designed to protect nesting wildlife and its young during this vulnerable period and is in no way intended to discourage the use of trained dogs during the hunting seasons.

The role hunting dogs play in preventing needless crippling loss of game birds and waterfowl is well recognized, as well as the pleasurable dimension the companionship of a trained dog adds to a hunting trip.

Dog training and competitive field trials are encouraged at other times of the year and are accommodated on many of the Commission's wildlife management areas.

During the April through July period, dogs may be trained at any time in nonproductive habitat.
