

"The Diary of Anne Frank" In Rehearsal

A Pulitzer Prize-winning drama, **The Diary of Anne Frank**, is now in rehearsal at Treasure Valley Community College. It will be the final dramatic production of the year and will be presented as one of the highlights of Fine Arts Week, May 15, 16, and 17.

The **Diary of Anne Frank** is the true story of a young Jewish girl in Holland during World War II. When the Germans invaded Holland, many Jews went into hiding and like the Franks, lived in daily fear of being discovered and sent to prison camps. Anne kept a diary of events during the two years she lived secretly with her family in the upstairs of a building in Amsterdam. After the war her father Otto Frank published her story, **Anne Frank: Diary of a Young Girl**. From this book, Frances Goodrich and Albert Hackett have fashioned a sensitive and moving drama. They have captured the warmth, wonder, anguish and humor of life portrayed in the diary as the Jews attempt to carry on in spite of war and the Germans.

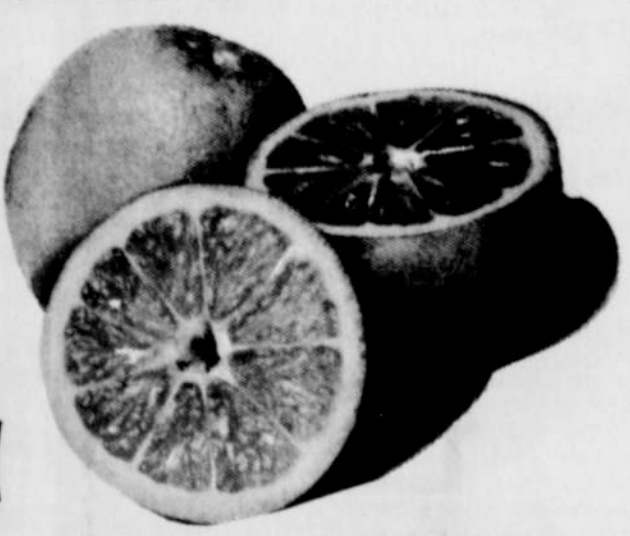
