Sixth Grades Go To Unity

On Tuesday, May 20, the sixth grade rooms went to Yellow Pine Campground near Unity. The teachers and some parents went too. The sixth grades were studying about trees, plants and wildlife. This was the last project to finish up Outdoor Education.

We left about 9:15 a.m. and got to Yellow Pine about 11:30. We pitched our tents and rolled out our sleeping bags before we ate lunch.

Tuesday afternoon, after we had eaten, we were divided into two groups. One group took a bus tour. First they went to Unity Lake and Mr. Fishburn from the Forest Service explained about all the uses of the lake. The bus tour then went to a sagebrush area southwest of Unity. Differences between the forest and sagebrush areas were discussed.

The tour then went on to Whiskey Creek where a large, severe forest fire had been. This forest fire which happened in 1967 burned over 7000 acres and killed quite a bit of wild life. Each person then got to plant one or more young trees in the burned area.

The other group was divided into small groups and they attended classes in the campground area. One was on fire-fighting, one was on wildlife and law enforcement.

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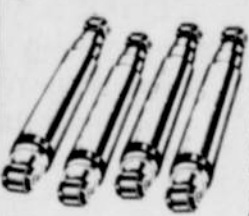
