

Art Program Planned For TVCC Summer Session

A comprehensive art program is planned for the summer session at Treasure Valley Community College. Both regular classes and week-long workshops are being planned in Painting, Drawing, Photography and Ceramics.

Regular classes will meet daily from 8:30 - 12:00 a.m., Monday through Thursday, for the first five weeks of the summer school, providing an intensive but complete program. Several outings are

planned for the photography and painting groups and the ceramics class expects to go on a clay dig. According to Chairman Ken O'Connell, "any scenic place where we can have a picnic and dig clay will do. There is usable ceramic clay just about any place along the River."

After the five-week session, students may enroll in the workshops for a more informal learning experience. A one-week workshop in Photography under instructor

Charles Bogard will be held June 16 through 22, and following that a one-week workshop in Painting under Mike McGuire will be held from August 11 through 16. Both these workshops will be taught outdoors and will involve traveling and camping.

Tentative plans have been made to offer a workshop in Ceramics under the direction of two Baker artists, Mary Sue Rightmire and Maggie Carlson. Both of these young

women were formerly on the staff of Treasure Valley Community College, and are currently involved in starting a pottery studio in Baker. They will have an extensive exhibit at the Crossroads Art Center in Baker beginning June 1.

The regular classes and workshops each carry two hours of transfer credit except for photography. The photo class is a three-credit nontransfer course, and the photo workshop earns two non-transfer credits.

Four-Day Astrology Workshop Offered

Johnny Lister's four-day workshop in Astrology will be offered at Treasure Valley Community College, June 11 through 14. This includes Astrology I, which deals with sun signs, and Intermediate Astrology which deals with planets, houses and aspects.

One of Lister's recent students, Claire Jenkins, describes the course as

"fascinating" and much like a course in psychology. "You get to know everyone's personality. You understand why people act the way they do and you accept them more easily. You also get an insight into your own personality and behavior."

Cost of the complete course is \$25, five of which is

Nyssa Foreman Ends Service

Red McCrady, one of two remaining employees of the Amalgamated Sugar Company who helped build the Nyssa Factory in 1937, retired this week from the sugar business.

Effective June 1, McCrady completed 38 years of work at the Nyssa factory. He was first employed as a construction laborer and, for the last

29 years, has been the agricultural repair foreman. He helped build the Nampa factory in 1942 and was involved in the construction of Nyssa's pulp dryer in 1940. In 1972, he had open heart surgery, but recovered soon enough to finish his work before retirement. McCrady and his wife, Vera, have six children.
