Fire Season Starts In Parts of Oregon

In the wake of several small fires, State Forester J. E. Schroeder has officially declared fire season in most of Southern and West Central Oregon.

All of Douglas, Klamath, Lakeview, Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson, Hood River, Wasco, Josephine and Jackson Counties along with parts of Wheeler, Harney and Curry Counties are covered by proclamations already effective or soon to take effect.

Declaration of fire season means that local residents

must obtain permits before burning any debris and forest workers must have fire equipment and watchmen at all active operations sites.

Fire season is being declared somewhat later than usual in these areas, according to Schroeder. While precipitation last winter was about average, temperatures were somewhat below normal delaying fire season slightly.

The remainder of Oregon, Schroeder indicated, will be placed in fire season as soon as conditions warrant.

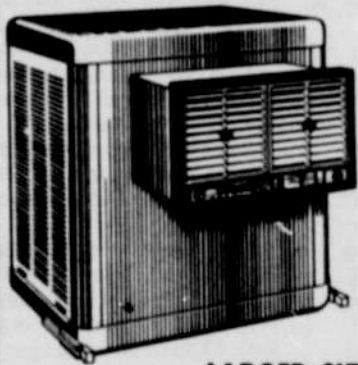
