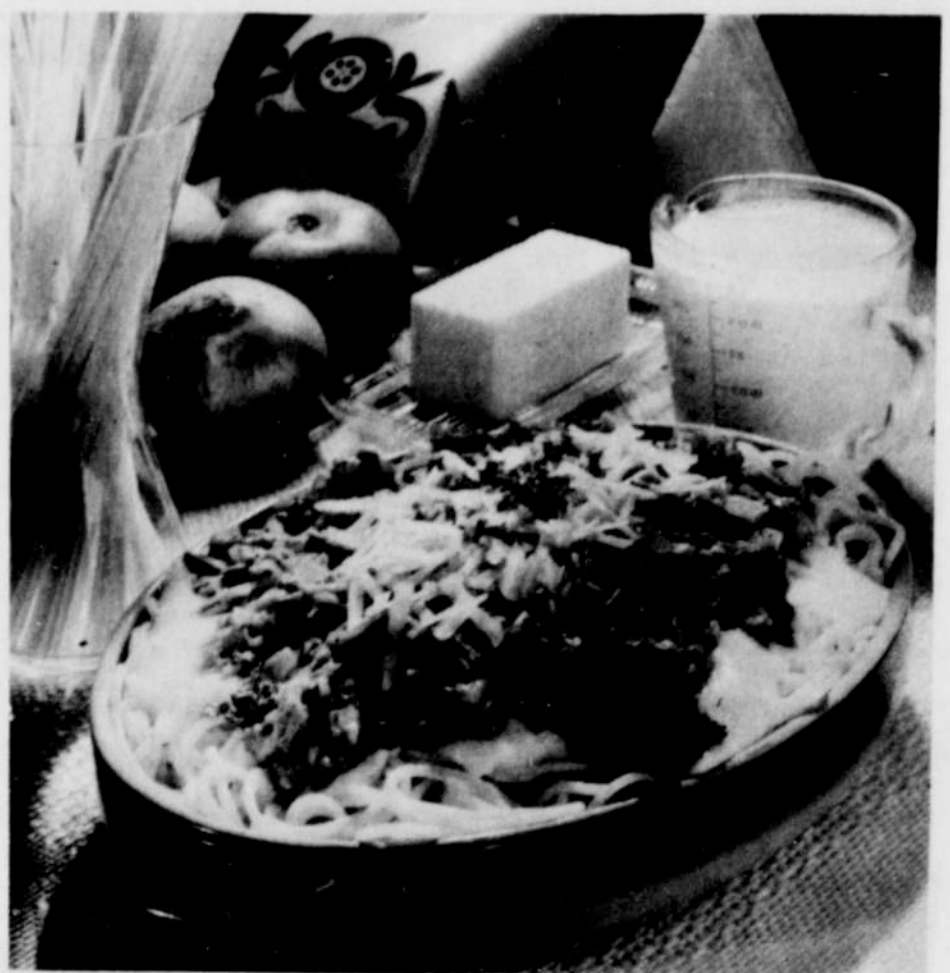

## SPAGHETTI WITH CHEESE AND CLAMS

1 onion, chopped  
6 tablespoons butter

2 medium tomatoes, chopped  
Salt  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
1/4 teaspoon basil  
1 (10 ounce) can whole baby clams, drained  
2 tablespoons minced parsley  
2 tablespoons flour  
1 chicken bouillon cube  
1 cup milk  
1/4 cup grated romano cheese  
8 ounces spaghetti  
Boiling salted water

Saute onion in 3 tablespoons butter 3 minutes. Add tomatoes, 1/4 teaspoon salt, pepper and basil. Simmer, stirring often, 15 minutes. Stir in clams and parsley. Heat through and keep warm. Melt remaining 3 tablespoons butter. Blend in flour and bouillon cube. Stir in milk and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cook, stirring until melted. Keep warm. Cook spaghetti in boiling salted water 8 to 10 minutes. Drain. Turn into heated bowl. Pour on hot cheese sauce. Spoon hot clam sauce over top. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup cheese. Makes 4 servings.
