Saute onion in 3 tablespoons butter 3 minutes. Add tomatoes, 3/4 teaspoon salt, pepper and basil. Simmer, stirring often, 15 minutes. Stir in clams and parsley. Heat through and keep wam. Melt remaining 3 tablespoons butter. Blend in flour and bouillon cube. Stir in milk and 1/4 teaspoon salt. Cook, stirring until melted. Keep warm. Cook spaghetti in boiling salted water 8 to 10 minutes. Drain. Turn into heated bowl. Pour on hot cheese sauce. Spoon hot clam sauce over top. Sprinkle with remaining 1/4 cup cheese. Makes 4 servings.
