Hartley Qualifies For Overseas Mat Team

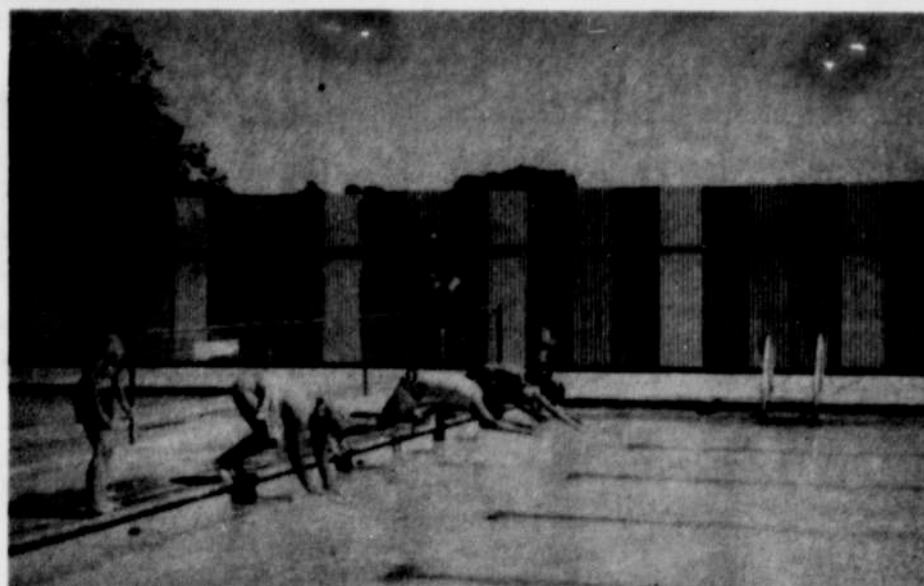

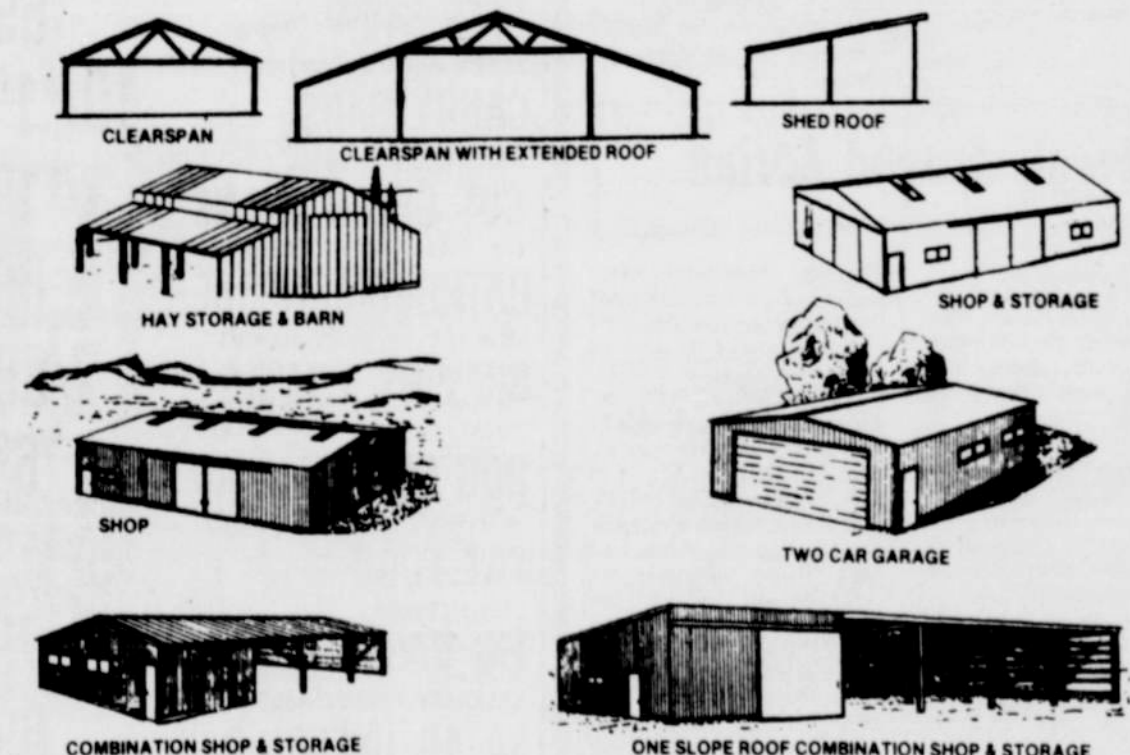
