Nyssa 4-H Girls Enter Spring Fair

The Malheur County Spring 4-H Fair was held June 10-12 in Ontario, with several Nyssa home economics and art clubs participating.

Forty nine Nyssa 4-H'ers prepared 81 exhibits and entered 67 contests in the areas of foods, clothing, art, leather craft and knitting.

The Fair provides many contests in food and clothing, as well as sewing and food judging contests. The girls do not compete with each other, but are judged according to their own abilities. Exhibitions are entered by the year accomplished, while contests are divided into age groups: Junior, 9-11, Intermediate, 12-14 and Senior, 15-19.

Participants from Nyssa were from ten clubs, 40 Junior members, 8 Intermediate members and one Senior. Several won awards.

Tina Hopman and Kathy Shell exhibited clothing and both won blue ribbon State awards. They will exhibit at the Oregon State Fair in August.

Tara Madrid was named Champion Exhibitor in the Foods II division and was presented with a Betty Crocker Boys and Girls cookbook.

Mike Thiel and Lisa Sarazin entered the Junior Better Breakfast Contest as a team. They were expected to prepare a nutritionally sound meal for four at a total cost of not more than three dollars. They prepared and served the meal to invited guests, while being judged on preparation, serving and clean-up. Both won blue ribbons.
