Jimmie Nedrow was a Thursday overnight guest of Andy Peutz.

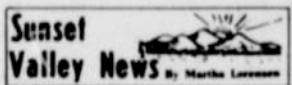
Sunday, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Nedrow and Jimmie went to the Owyhee Dam and had a picnic.
