## Graphoanalysis

Does Graphoanalysis have any connection with psychology? This question was asked recently and the answer was, "Yes, it does have a connection."

One definition of psychology according to Webster is, "The aggregate of the emotions, traits, and behavior patterns regarded as characteristic of an individual." While Graphoanalysis is the study of the same emotions, traits and behavior patterns as indicated by strokes in the handwriting. (It does not matter which hand or foot is used to hold the writing instrument).

Graphoanalysis can point out the particular stroke that indicates the trait. In the following example the small squared loop at the beginning of a letter structure is the stroke that indicates that well-known green-eyed monster Jealousy. While this stroke is very easy to see, it is not so easy to explain without the help of some knowledge of just what jealousy means to the person suffering from it. The definition of jealousy is, "the fear of being displaced, fear of not being loved, feeling of insecurity, a need for approval, a need to feel important to some one person."

An article in July 1975 Readers Digest entitled "How to Cope with Jealousy" gives some good advice and ends with the following quote, "When allowed to go unquestioned, jealousy remains malevolent. Examined in the light of reason, it can be a stimulus to growth."
