I hope I can come back to live and go to college.

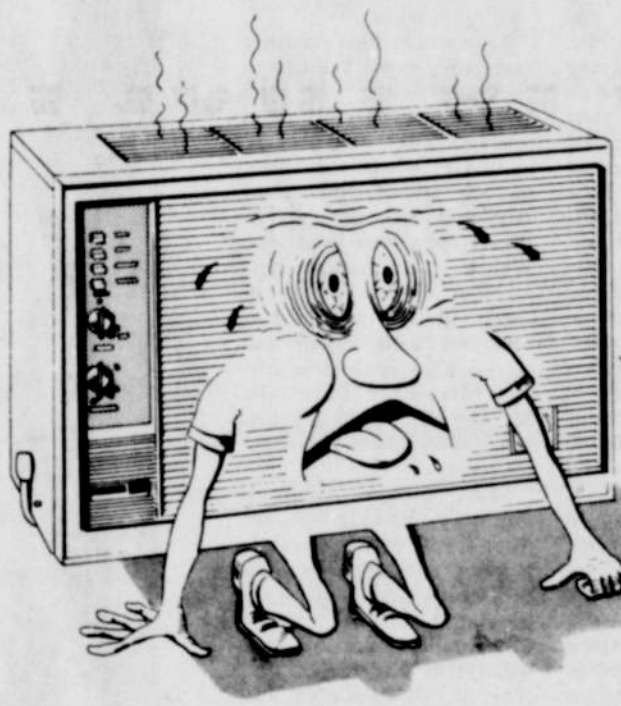

- Ventilate attics, either with vents or fans.
- Clean or replace air conditioner filters at least once a month.
- Close off unoccupied rooms.
- Buy cooling equipment with the correct capacity (not too big, not too small) for the job it has to do.
