Your County Agent Says

Always in the early fall months we have losses of cattle from pulmonary emphysema, where cattle start coming off of short dry grass onto lush green aftermath pasture. This rapid change of diet causes this costly nutritional disease to erupt. Management practices that help are to feed some dry hay for a few days or let the cattle onto the new feed only a few hours a day for a couple of weeks. Symptoms of the disease are labored breathing, slobbering and, finally, death. Your local veterinarian, no doubt, is familiar with the disease and can spot it quickly if given the opportunity to look at the cattle.

Research into possible control procedures that can be applied to date have yielded no satisfactory answer other than feed management.

Occasionally we get complaints of bitterness in cucumbers. This is caused by a chemical called curcubitacin that is generated in the plant. The problem is worse in some varieties than others. Bitterness tends to concentrate in the stem end of the vegetable.

Several factors appear to influence the amount of bitterness. Here are some of them.—The problem is worse during cool growing seasons. Large fluctuations in soil moisture can contribute to the cause. Also, bitterness varies from variety to variety. Slicing cucumbers are less affected than pickling types. Pickling appears to destroy the bitter taste and no special effort has been made to develop the pickling varieties without the problem.

Bitterness is concentrated in the stem end and peeling of the cucumbers. Removing the stem end and outer shell usually removes the unpleasant taste.
