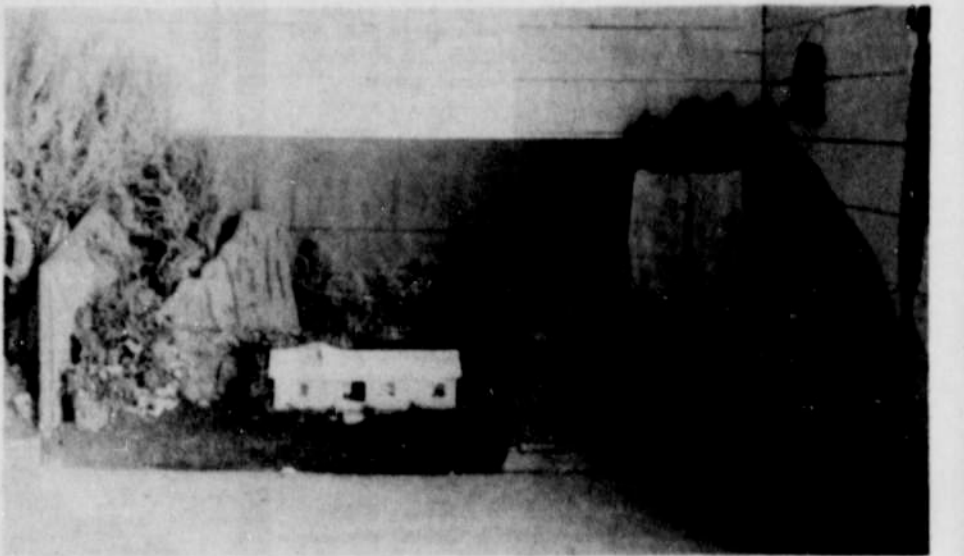
Mrs. Robert Coble, Richland, spoke to the members about the importance and satisfaction of taking part in all grange activities.

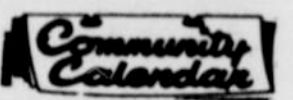
