**Speaker Opposes  
Equal Rights Law**

Mary Helm is on tour of Southern Idaho expressing strong opposition to the Equal Rights Amendment to the Federal Constitution.

She is convinced the Amendment will do nothing to benefit women in Idaho. The E.R.A. Power Grab is not all that it has been cracked up to be according to the Oklahoma State Senator who will be speaking at Nampa High School, Little Theatre, on Monday evening, November 17 at 8 p.m.

State Senator Mary Helm says, "The E. R. A. will mean whatever the U. S. Supreme Court says it means." She points out that "During the last few decades the federal government has grabbed control of affairs that should be in the hands of local people. Our schools are a good example."

She adds, "The Supreme Court has consistently approved these federal power grabs." Senator Helm contends that, "If the Equal Rights Amendment is ratified, the Idaho Legislature will no longer have any power over such matters as marriage, divorce, child support, rape, inheritance, child custody, and property rights. They will be matters for the federal government to decide."

She also points to the question of allowing homosexuals to teach: "To deny a homosexual the right to teach in public schools would violate the E.R.A.'s prohibition of discrimination on account of sex." She asserts that, "Any state law against homosexual teachers would thus be rendered null and void by the courts under the E.R.A."

Senator Helm's speech entitled **Reject or Repeal the E.R.A.** is open to the public and is sponsored by local chapters of The John Birch Society.

She will also speak at Meridian Junior High School Friday, November 14 at 8 p.m. The public is invited to hear these important speeches. Modest admission charge.

**Lemon Gold From The West**



Remember how good old-fashioned bread pudding tasted on a crisp, cold fall or wintery night? In pioneer days it was considered a rare treat because there was seldom bread "left over" to use for such an elegant dessert. The chance of topping it off with lemon sauce was almost unheard of, except for the lucky California settlers who found that their new homeland was blessed with sun ripened lemons and gold, too!

You never, or hardly ever, find a gold nugget today, but you can find California and Arizona fresh lemons in your market all year 'round.

**SUTTER'S GOLD BREAD PUDDING**  
(8 servings)

3 cups milk	3 cups lightly packed stale whitebread cubes*
2 eggs	1 cup seedless raisins
½ cup sugar	1 tablespoon fresh grated lemon peel
½ teaspoon salt	
½ teaspoon nutmeg	

In medium saucepan over medium heat, heat milk until tiny bubbles form around the edge. Meanwhile, in 1½-quart casserole, with wire whisk or fork, beat eggs, sugar, salt and nutmeg until well combined. Gradually beat hot milk into egg mixture. Stir in bread cubes, raisins and grated peel. Place casserole in shallow baking pan; pour hot water 1 inch deep around dish. Bake at 350° F. for 1 hour or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Serve pudding warm with Lemon Sauce.

\*If you use one of the "soft" brands of white bread, allow 30 minutes longer for cooking. To dry fresh bread, place in oven at 200° F. for 1 hour.

**LEMON SAUCE**

½ cup sugar	½ teaspoon fresh grated lemon peel
1 tablespoon cornstarch	2 tablespoons fresh squeezed lemon juice
1 cup water	
2 tablespoons butter	

In small saucepan, thoroughly combine sugar and cornstarch. Add water, stirring until smooth. Bring to boil over medium heat, stirring constantly; cook 1 to 2 minutes. Stir in butter, lemon peel and juice. Serve warm over bread pudding. Makes 1½ cups.
