Interested In Making Photography Pay?

Interested in making photography pay? A new course in the Winter Schedule at Treasure Valley Community College is called Photo-Journalism, meeting Tuesday evening at 7 p.m. Dave Allen, full-time freelance photographer, will conduct the three-credit hour class and encourage members to market some of their work. Mr. Allen will cover such areas as copywriting, field work, pricing photos, mailing and establishing outlets for sales.

Mr. Allen's hobby is nature and wildlife photography; and he has actively photographed in Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Nevada, California and Western Canada. He has a degree in Journalism Photography from the University of Wyoming and currently is on a nine-month assignment with the Professional Rodeo Cowboys' Association. He has published in newspapers, magazines, and books, and does a great deal of advertising and public relations work.

The class will be conducted in a seminar fashion, and each student will have full 24-hour access to the campus lab facilities and equipment. Mr. Allen would like students to have a background in black and white photography. The course is directed toward the person who has used a camera and wants his results to go out to others. Students may have work currently underway, or begin on some facet of their own choosing during the term. Students are encouraged to bring some of their work in prints or slides for the first night.
