The Nyssa Bulldogs moved on to Madras Saturday to

play the Madras White Buffalos, and came out with another road win, 64-55.

The Bulldogs came out to win and were never behind in the ball game. In the first quarter with 2 minutes gone in the period Pro Escobedo hit a field goal to start the Bulldog scoring. Alberto Escobedo added 2 more field goals with Kent Blanch's free throw and 6 points from Bill Marcum and the end of the first quarter Nyssa led 13 to 10.

In the second quarter Nyssa outscored Madras 19 points to 10 points and at halftime Nyssa led by 12 points 32 to 20.

The third quarter saw Madras' Mark Eades score 9 of 10 free throws and score three field goals to cut Nyssa's lead to 11. Nyssa answered with Dirk Sappe dumping in 4 field goals for 8 points, Bill Marcum 4 point, Alberto Escobedo 2 and Kent Blanch a free throw to close the gap but Madras had gained 18 to Nyssa's 17 to end the quarter 49 to 38 in Nyssa's favor.

Bulldogs Win Two On Road Over Prineville, Madras

NYSSA 47, PRINEVILLE 43

Nyssa Bulldogs were hosted by the Crook County Cowboys Friday night in Prineville, and the Bulldogs came from behind to score a 47-43 victory.

The Bulldogs were cold in the first quarter and didn't score until 2:10 to go. Bill Marcum sunk a long shot to start the Bulldogs, then Kent Blanch and Ron King each added 2 points and Marcum added 2 more buckets to pull the Bulldogs within one point at the end of the first period.

In the second period the Cowboys outscored the Bulldogs on 3 field goals and 8 free throws to Nyssa's 5 field goals and go in at halftime with a 5 point lead.

The Bulldogs started coming on in the third quarter and with 1:40 to go, Bill Marcum tied the game for the first time at 32 all and with 7 seconds left, Bill put up another to tie it at 36 all.

The fourth quarter saw the Bulldogs play defense and held Crook County to 7 points while they added 11, with 6 of those from 2 field goals and 2 free throws by Kent Blanch.

Kent's free throws put Nyssa ahead at 42 to 41 and the Bulldogs were never behind in the last 4 minutes of play.
