School Buildings Underway

The long months of speculation and planning are over, and the school board has awarded final contracts for the reconstruction of our schools. Now we can watch the buildings take shape, secure in the knowledge that we will have excellent facilities to replace those lost almost two years ago in the June 5, 1974 fire.

The high school classroom building will soon be finished. perhaps before the end of this school year. Footings for the gymnasium-auditorium are being poured, starting today. And now contracts have been awarded for the elementary multipurpose room and cafeteria.

We have mentioned it before, but we don't think enough appreciation can be given to those individuals who have worked so long and so hard to provide these facilities. Meeting almost every week, and sometimes more often, these past two years has been a time-consuming effort of true dedication.

The job was so large because these people weren't charged with the responsibility of replacing just one building, but with the job of planning for replacement of almost the entire school system

That the job has been frustrating at times goes without saying. Site planning, preliminary estimates, and approval of a bond issue all took time. Then before plans could be drawn and bids opened, inflation had taken its toll and actual costs were higher than estimated.

Compromises have been made, plans changed, and options eliminated. Out of it all, though, have come decisions that are right, and we will have a school facility second to none in our area.

We would like to name the people responsible for these decisions. They are the ones who have put in the long hours. and it is impossible in news stories to give each of them the recognition that they deserve.

School board members are Mark Hartley, Gene Stunz, Vic Haburchak, Bill Schilling, Gerald Simantel, Don Bullard, Keith Langley and Don Engstrom.

Budget Board members are Don Dirksen, Val Garner, Richard Mejia, Joel Mitchell, Farrell Peterson, Harvey Wilmot and Duane Drydale.

Building Committee members are Dick Tensen. Bob Wilson, Arleigh Adams, Janetta Garner, Marge Jackson, Woodrow Seuell and Cy Bock.

These are the people who, in addition to Superintendent W. L. McPartland, and Principals Gene Chester, Dan Martin and Mel Munn, are responsible for a dedicated and excellent job. They deserve our thanks and appreciation.




