Hiring of Illegal Aliens Prohibited

The Labor Department announced today it has won a court order barring an Oregon farm labor contractor from hiring illegal aliens.

U. S. District Judge Robert Belloni issued the permanent injunction against Alvin N. Luttrell, doing business as Northwest Harvesters. Luttrell agreed to the entry of the judgement without contest.

In addition, Luttrell was enjoined for violating the vehicle safety and payroll record keeping provisions of the Farm Labor Contractor Registration Act.

The Labor Department's investigation against Luttrell was directed by Donald W. Henry, area director in Portland for the Wage-Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration.
