The dam is not completely full as yet. 12 feet still remaining until the level of the dam would be reached, but it was felt wise to run some of the water off now before the spring floods started down the Owyhee.

With the filling of the dam, the Owyhee project is as-

sured of a full two years water supply, even if all the lands were under cultivation.

50 YEARS AGO

From present indications the fruit growers of this section may look for an unusually early bloom this year. W.L. Shovel, county agent, and some of the prominent growers, say that the fruit buds are at least two weeks in advance in growth over average years.

It will be remembered in the spring of 1900 following a mild winter, peaches, prunes and apricots were in full bloom on March 1 and were not injured by the frost.
