BSU Science Day**

Top science students from 30 high schools in Idaho and Oregon, including five from Nyssa, will be at Boise State University April 3 to compete for \$5,000 in scholarships and a chance to take home trophies in BSU's eighth annual Science Competition Day. The Nyssa students are Neal Oldemeyer, John Strickland, Dan Simantel, Larry Haney and Vong Toan. Students will take a general test that features sections from several scientific fields. Scholarship money will be divided between

the top finishers from large, medium and small sized schools.

In addition to the scholarships, team champions will be crowned to overall school winners in each size category. Trophies will also be awarded to top student teams in the subject areas of math, geology, biology, physics and chemistry.
