Coast Guard To Examine Boats

Boat safety examinations are now being given by the local Coast Guard Auxiliary and persons interested may get folders containing new boating rules at the Firestone Store, Coast to Coast or Ron's Shell Service.

These examinations are voluntary and if your boat passes the requirements you will receive a decal stating your boat has met Coast Guard safety standards. If your boat is declared unsafe, there is no report to anyone but the owner, and another exam is scheduled. Last year the local auxiliary which is headquartered in Ontario examined more boats than any other auxiliary in the Northwest.
