

Bulldogs Sweep Burns Doubleheader

The Nyssa Bulldogs swept a doubleheader Saturday from the Burns Hilanders by scores of 6-3 and 8-1, and those victories plus a split by Vale with Grant Union opened the door a little for the Bulldogs to get back into the Greater Oregon race.

The wins Saturday over the Hilanders saw the Bulldog pitching come thru in Dion Garner and Bill Marcum, and also some good defensive plays especially from center fielder Larry Haney.

Garner pitched the first game for Nyssa striking out 9 and holding Burns to 3 runs on 9 hits. Marcum in the second game allowed 6 hits and only one run while striking out 13 Hilanders.

In the second game Marcum hit his first grand slam home run to score Moffis, Haney and Perez ahead of him.

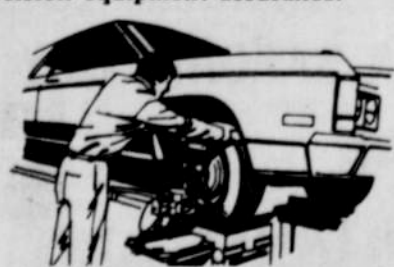
