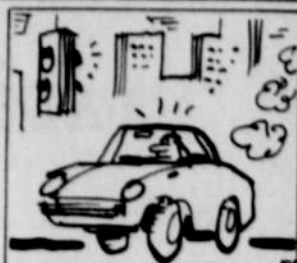
FIGHTING INFLATION

Fortunately, concerned legislators are helping to keep their TV free, although there are people who want to allow pay-cable TV networks to siphon off the best programs and then charge viewers for watching them.

According to W. Dean Mason, former president of the National Geriatric Society: "Almost one third, or 6.5 million, of our nation's elderly can be classified as poor or near-poor. In addition, approximately 50 percent of all older women have incomes below the poverty level. Should we impose unnecessary financial obligations upon older Americans who are in need of leisure time experiences which will help them in their pursuit of a meaningful life?"
