State Vehicle Code Effective July 1

Oregon drivers will be faced with learning many new or changed traffic laws on July 1, when the state's new vehicle code takes effect.

At the same time, many drivers will be required for the first time to appear in person at a Motor Vehicles Division office to renew their driver's licenses and get color photo licenses.

Chester W. Ott, Administrator of the Motor Vehicles Division, said Friday the two laws represent the most sweeping changes in rules of the road, the method of handling traffic charges in

courts, and driver licensing in about 40 years.

A program to inform drivers of the new or changed rules of the road and other related laws will begin June 1, Ott said.

The new vehicle code was enacted by the 1975 Legislature.

In addition to changes in many driving rules, the code provides a more efficient way to deal with alleged traffic violators and establishes a new offense known as a "traffic infraction." Conviction of a traffic infraction can result only in a fine, bail

forfeiture, license suspension or other civil penalty.

The new code classifies infractions into four groups, depending on the seriousness of the offense as it relates to highway safety. It establishes a maximum fine for each classification, ranging from \$1,000 for a Class A infraction to \$50 for a Class D infraction.

The color photo driver's license program, also enacted by the 1975 Legislature, will provide a better means of

identifying the state's licensed drivers and make it more difficult to counterfeit or tamper with a driver's license.

Oregon will be the 33rd state to adopt a photo license, and the last western state to switch to photo driver licenses. Experience in other states indicates the public will like the program even though it means a trip to a Motor Vehicles Division office once every four years, Ott said.

AUSTRIAN TORTE ADAPTED FOR EASY LIVING

EASY STRAWBERRY TORTE

- 1 package Royal Custard Flavored Dessert
- 1-3/4 cups milk
- 2 packages whipped topping mix
- 2 (8-inch) sponge cake layers, split
- 1 jar (12 ounce) strawberry jam
- Fresh strawberries
- Flaked coconut, tinted green

In a saucepan combine Royal Custard Flavored Dessert and 1 cup milk. Bring to a full boil over a low heat, stirring constantly. Pour into a bowl and chill until firm.

Combine chilled custard, whipped topping mix and remaining 3/4 cup milk. Beat until mixture is smooth and holds peaks. Fill cake layers alternately with whipped custard and strawberry jam. Top cake with remaining whipped custard.

Decorate with strawberries and tinted coconut. Makes one 8-inch cake.



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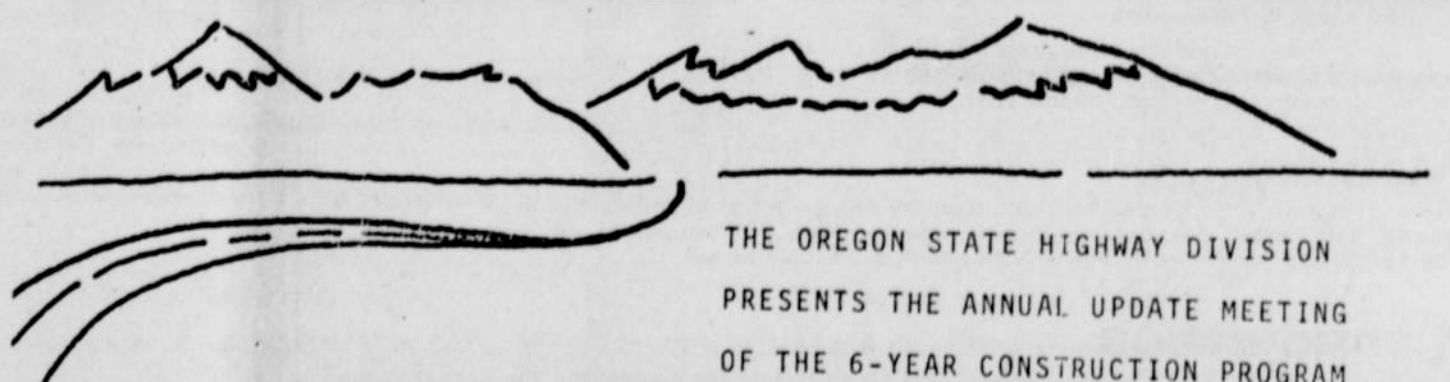
