Frahm's home. It is the center of life on a working ranch. Considerable land has been added to the place since they took possession, but the character of the place remains the same. There is a flock of sheep, a herd of milk cows, several peafowl, chickens, a sow and pigs, various barns, sheds, shops, the old tack room painted red, dogs of various breeds, and a very large herd of beef cattle, which lends the flavor of the old west, especially, at branding time.

There are several hired men, some of whom board and room at the house. Mrs. Frahm cooks for all the men, who eat at least the noon meal with them. She does all her own work, plus being a typical farm wife, who can run for parts, or take over wherever needed.

Mrs. Frahm says she is not ready to turn the house into a museum piece-it is still a very pleasant, living home-just mellows with age.
