Judo Club Makes Plans To Construct Building

Ontario members of the Ore-Ida Judo Club Boosters board of directors and the club's black belt holders met Tuesday evening to discuss the need for a new facility for the judo program.

During the past year the club has had to make three moves and has lost the use of its present facilities. It was decided by those at the meeting that it was necessary to build a facility for the judo club to enable it to carry out its program.

Each year between 80 and 100 boys participate in the program and the club has over 20 black belt instructors, who donate their time, which accounts for the fact that it is rated among the top clubs in the northwest.

In order to provide permanent and adequate facilities it was decided at the

meeting Tuesday evening that the club should undertake a building program. Preliminary plans call for the construction of a building on a lot adjacent to the Jaycee Hall in Ontario. The Jaycees have granted the club a 99-year lease for the property.

Judo boosters plan to start a drive in the very near future to raise approximately \$50,000 to finance the construction of the building. Teams will be working throughout the valley contacting friends of the judo program to ask their assistance in financing the building.

It is hoped to have the building completed in time for the start of the judo season -- about September 15th.

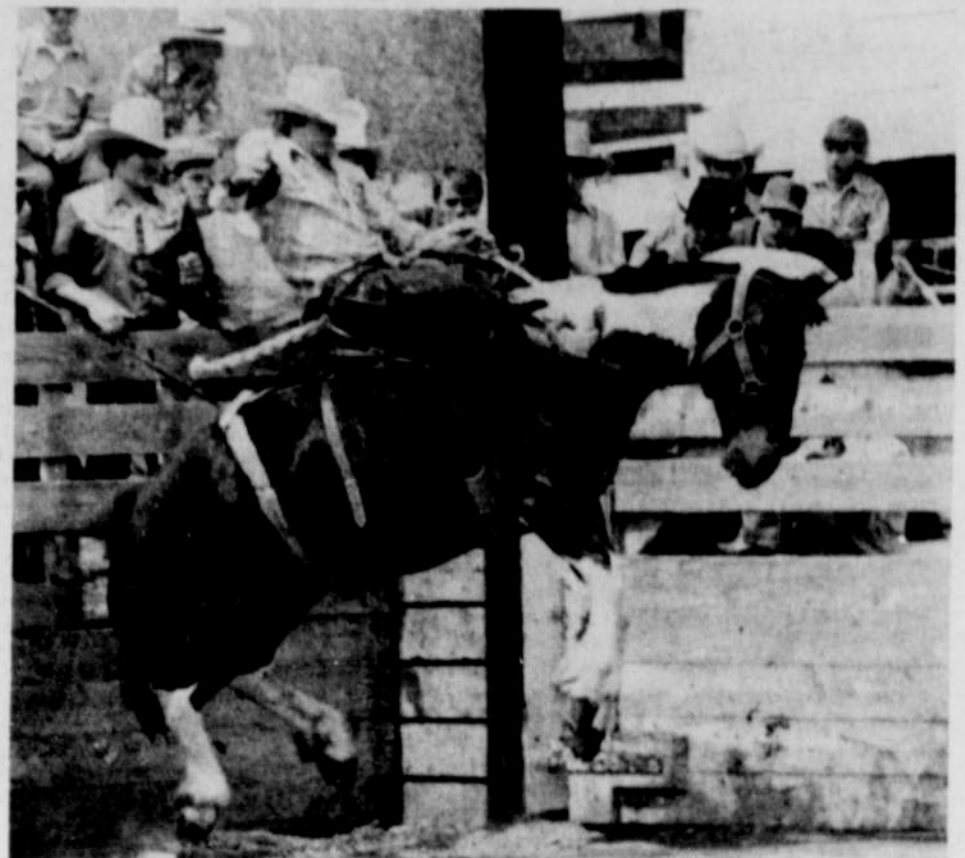

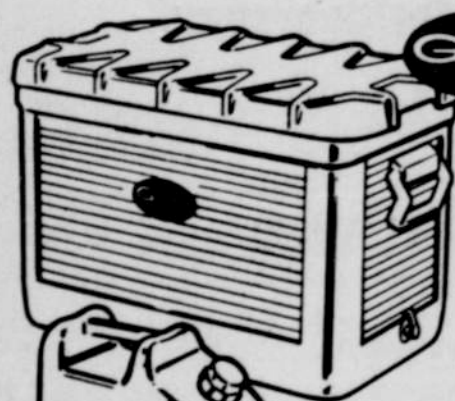

The entry fee may be mailed in, but it must be received not later than 5:00 p.m. on June 18, 1976 to be eligible.

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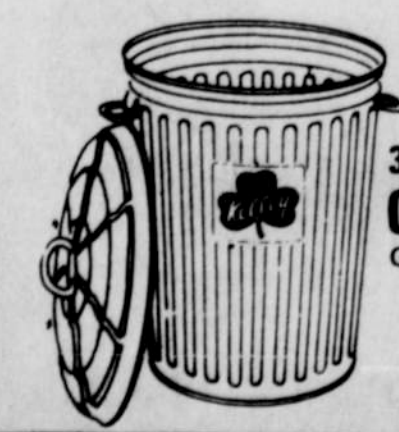


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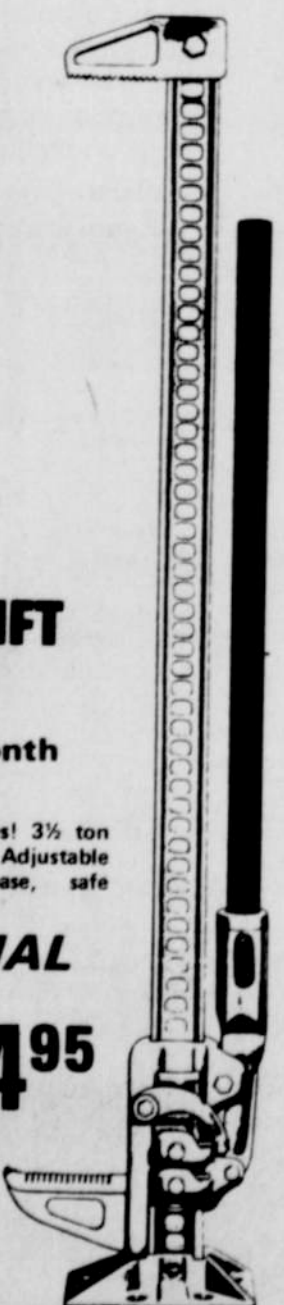
