Summer Swim Season Underway, Meet Today

The Nyssa Swim Team is now in the midst of its summer season. The team, comprised of persons from 6 to 18 years, has seven meets on tap, including one today, Thursday, at Ontario. In Ontario they will take on Ontario, Parma and Emmett.

Later on this summer they will compete in three championship meets. The first from July 30 to August 1 in Payette, is the State "B" championship. Swimmers need not meet qualifying times to enter. A week later, August 6-8 in Blackfoot, the State "A" championships will require each entrant to meet qualifying times.

The Treasure Valley championships will be August 14-15, again at Payette.

The events include all the different competitive swimming strokes. Individual races are held in the butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle. There is also an individual medley, where the swimmer must use all four of

the above strokes. Relay races include a medley relay and a freestyle relay.

Swimmers under ten years old swim 50 yards in their races and in the relays each of the four competitors swim 25 yards.

Those over 11 years old, swim 100 yards in individual races and 50 yards each in relays.

The coaches are Megan Jackson, and Julie Anderson.
