

Two FNB Bankers Change Positions

Veteran banker Carl L. Leth, manager of First National Bank of Oregon's Redmond branch, has been promoted to assistant manager of the large Ontario office, announced Vice President and Manager Jim Leslie.

He replaces Charles K. Rackleff who was promoted to manager of the Lakeview branch.

Leth, a native of Idaho, was graduated from Buhl High School and later attended the University of Idaho where he received a bachelor of science degree in agriculture.

Leth, joined First National in 1968 and was named development officer assigned to the agribusiness services department of the following year. In March 1972, he was named regional sales officer with the Portland regional administration and later that year, was named commercial loan officer at the Gresham branch. In April 1973 was named to open the new Redmond office as manager.

Leth and his wife Gwen, and son Aaron, will purchase a home in Ontario.
