INVITATION TO BID

SEALED PROPOSALS for the construction of sewage collection and treatment facilities, addressed to Honorable Mayor and Council, will be received at the office of the Rural Fire Protection District (Fire Hall), City of Adrian, State of Oregon until 8:00 o'clock P.M., local time, on the 5th day of August, 1976, and then will be publicly opened and read.

THE WORK contemplated consists of construction of approximately 8,290 feet of 8-inch sewers, a package type sewage lift station, a river crossing approximately 800 feet long, and approximately 4,900 feet of 4-inch pressure sewer, lagoon type treatment facilities and appurtenances.

PLANS AND specifications may be examined at the Office of the Engineer, CH2M Hill, Inc., 700 Clearwater Ave., P.O. Box 8748, Boise, Idaho 83702. A copy of said documents may be obtained at the Engineer's office upon a deposit of \$25 for each document. The full amount of the deposit will be refunded if said documents are returned in good condition within 30 days after bid opening.

NO PROPOSAL will be received or considered by the City or any Officer of the City unless the Proposal Form contains, or is accompanied by, a statement by the Bidder as a part of his proposal that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 shall be included in his contract.

EACH PROPOSAL must be submitted on the prescribed form and accompanied by a certified check or bid bond executed on the prescribed form, payable to the City of Adrian, Oregon, in an amount not less than 5 percent of the amount bid.

THE SUCCESSFUL bidder will be required to furnish a bond for faithful performance of the contract in the full amount of the contract price.

BIDDERS on this work will be required to comply with the provisions of the President's Executive Order No. 11246 and requirements issued thereunder. The requirements for bidders and contractors under this order are explained in the contract documents.

THE ATTENTION of Bidders is directed to the requirements and conditions of employment to be observed

and minimum wage rates to be paid under the contract. THE BIDDER must submit with his proposal the properly executed form of "Compliance Statement" in accordance with the Environmental Protection Agency special requirements. Bids received without this completed form will be considered nonresponsive. Before a contract will be awarded, the above will be subject to EPA approval.

THE RIGHT is reserved to reject any or all proposals, to postpone the award of the contract for a period not to exceed 90 days from the bid opening date, and to accept that Proposal which is to the best interests of The City of Adrian.

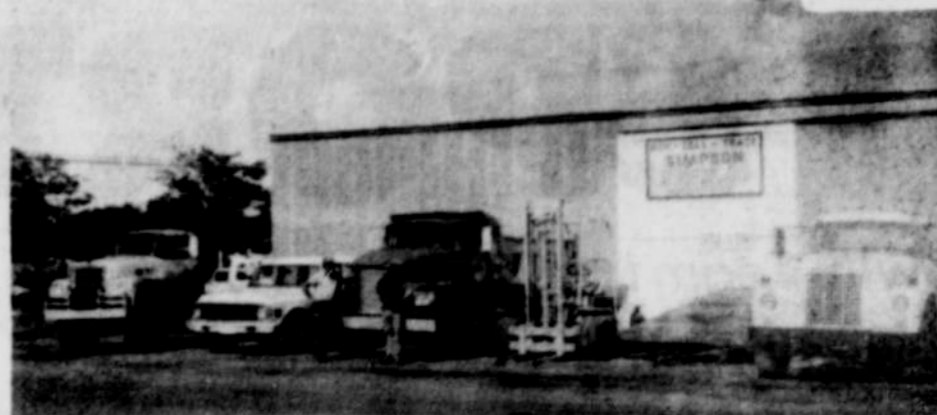

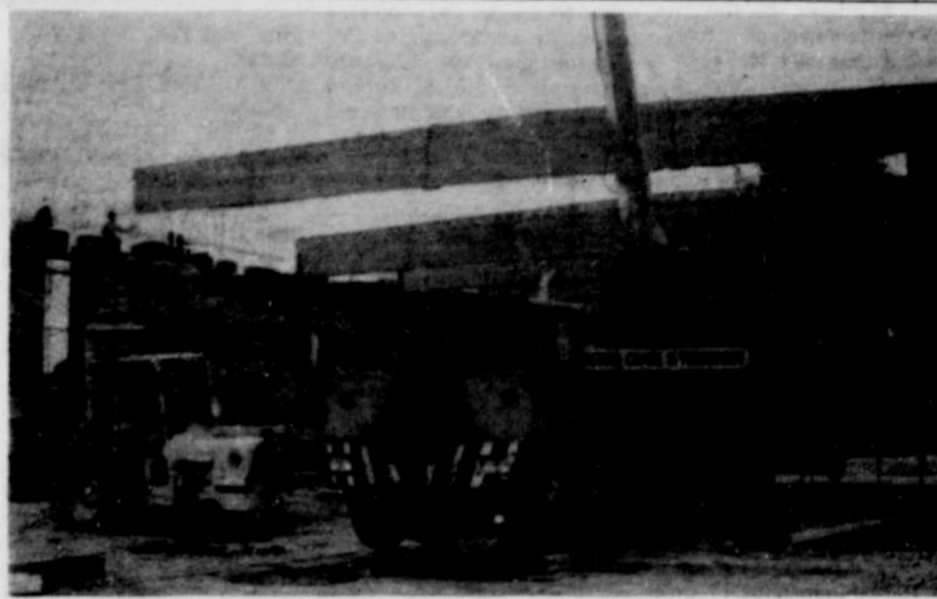
