

# Gunderson Couple To Observe 50 Years

Donna Verle Gunderson moved from Ritchfield, Idaho in 1918 with her parents, settling near Fruitland. She graduated from Fruitland high school in 1924 and attended the College of Idaho in Caldwell. She was a cook for the Ontario School District for a number of years.

The couple were both active members of the Ontario Assembly of God Church. They were also active members of the Payette Assembly of God Church prior to their move to Ontario in 1944.

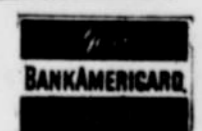
