Steer Market Carcass Evaluation

The carcass evaluation session for the market steers sold through the Malheur County Fat Stock Sale was held Wednesday evening, August 25, at Welles-Davies in Payette. USDA grade. Mel Wibbels checked 94 carcasses and established eleven factors which were used to evaluate the carcasses, reported Marilyn Mohr, Malheur County Extension Agent. The evaluating factors

included: maturity grade; amount of marbling present; quality grade (prime, choice, good); hot carcass weight; amount of backfat over the ribs; rib eye area; percent of kidney, pelvic and heart fat; yield grade; percent cutability; dressing percentage; and square inches of ribeye per one hundred pounds of bodyweight. This carcass and the one produced by Troy Hartley of Nyssa were tied for first place until the last factor was computed, noted Miss Mohr. Miss Mac Kenzie's steer had 2.28 square inches of ribeye for every one-hundred-pounds of body weight compared to 2.14 square inches in Mr. Hartley's steer.

The top three places in the carcass evaluation were Ada MacKenzie, Rockville, first; Troy Hartley, Nyssa, second; and Loretta Maag. Vale, third.
