The new buses are a far cry from the days of grandfather, who rode a horse, if he was fortunate, and waded through the snow if he was not. The new school bus seats approximately 40 students, in seven rows of seats with an aisle through the center. Seats are upholstered in durable leather, windows open like a Pullmans, and have the safety feature of non-shatterable glass.

Entrance is through the front door only, steps are broad. Air-conditioning is a feature, and the trucks will be cool in summer and warm in winter. They are painted orange and with black trim, with streamlined body.

The bus bodies were purchased by the non-high school district, with the trucking contractor furnishing his own chassis.
