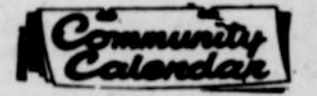
**EMBLEM CLUB ACTIVITIES**

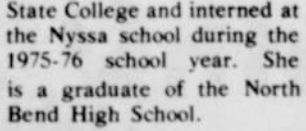
