Parma Downs Adrian, 65-12	
It has been a very rough year for the Adrian football team and last Friday was not an exception. Parma smashed the Antelopes by a 65-12 score in a nonleague game.	

It looked like perhaps the breaks were going to go the way of the Antelopes as Arthur Leos scored from two yards out after teammate Steve Ballard intercepted a Parma pass on the Parma 27 and returned the ball to the two-yard line.	
Seconds later Parma's Mike Edens took the kickoff and romped 80 yards for the first Panther touchdown. After that came the barrage.	

Panther Elloyd Montoya ran for three TD's and threw for another one. Parma's lead was stretched when an interception and a fumble recovery were turned into points.	
Leading the Adrian rushing attack was Dirk Miller who carried 17 times for 92 yards. Montoya led the Panthers with 56 yards.	

Praise for defensive play was given to Ballard and Pat Boles, both recent transfers to Adrian. Ballard, a junior from Sam Barlow in Gresham intercepted two passes. Bales a sophomore from Salt Lake, was cited for general defensive play.	
Nyssa, fielding its first team ever this year, dropped all four matches and learned that championship teams are not built overnight.	

Madras came out the tournament winner with a 4-0 record, followed by Wahtonka 3-1 and Grant Union 2-2, with the two local teams behind those.	
Vale lost to Madras 6-15, 10-15; beat Nyssa 15-1, 15-1; fell to Wahtonka 10-15, 15-13 13-15, and then lost to Grant Union 5-15, 15-10, 15-17. The Vikings had a very good chance to beat both Grant Union and Wahtonka and finish second, instead of fourth, in the tournament.	

Besides the loss to Vale, Nyssa fell to grant Union 2-15, 1-15; lost to Wahtonka 5-15, 5-15, and lost to Madras 0-15, 4-15.

The Nyssa Bulldogs turned everything around last Friday night, and whipped the highly rated Burns Hilanders with an awesome 34-14 performance.	

Rushing 349 yards on the ground with an offense that has been devastating all year, the defense caught fire with a few changes and held Burns to 249 yards and two touchdowns.	
Both teams lost enough yards in penalties to win an average game, with each suffering eleven penalties and 130 yards for Nyssa, 90 for Burns.	

Greg Moffis had another big evening, returning a punt for 62 yards at the start of the game, and following up with runs of 45 and 4 yards for two more touchdowns to take the stuffing out of Burns with only a little over a quarter played. From then on the teams were fairly even,	
but the damage had been done.	

In addition to Moffis' performance with 80 yards rushing, Alberto Escobedo had 117 yards, Dirk Sappe 97, Jim Wilson 46 and Kirt Michael 9.	
The Bulldogs take their potent offense to John Day this Friday for a game with the Grant Union Prospectors, and Coaches Art Bullock and Max Brittingham will continue to drill their charges on pass defense and more pass defense.
