Roosevelt was re-elected in Tuesday's balloting by an all time high for electoral minorities. Only two states, Maine and Vermont, with a total of eight electorial votes went to Landon and Knox while Roosevelt and Garner collected 523 votes. The new deal, popular plurality will reach around 9,000,000 as the final returns drift in.

In Oregon Roosevelt received approximately a two to one majority, gathering 154,080 votes to 76,623 for Landon out of 1225 precincts reported. In Malheur County Roosevelt received slightly more than twice the popular

A royal welcome awaited Dr. J.J. Sarazin Wednesday evening after a trip to Michigan. Several of the leading citizens were there, with the fire truck standing ready, as Frank Edwards presented the doctor with a huge bouquet of ripe sun-Nyssa's leading Republican to a choice seat on the fire
