Third Graders Make Etchings

This class of third grade students, taught by Mrs. Barbara Bullock, spent part of last Thursday afternoon making Thanksgiving etchings. The club enjoyed a bountiful Thanksgiving dinner meeting on November 17.

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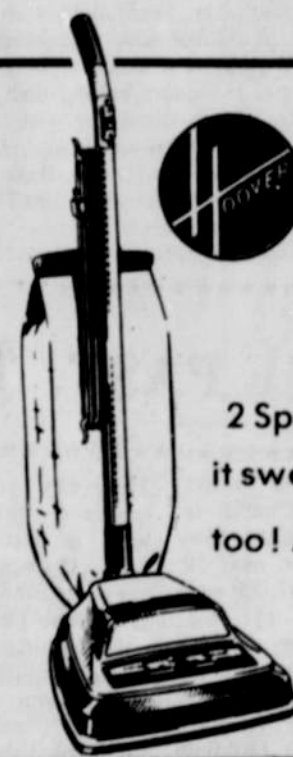
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
