



Bake a Beautiful Wheat Germ Bread

Wheat Germ Kringle a Holiday Must

Almost everyone looks forward to enjoying delectable homemade sweet breads and pastries during the holiday season. The beautifully shaped Danish kringle shown here is a perfect example of what one can do with versatile wheat germ and a special yeast dough. Wheat germ, of course, is that remarkable cereal which has been recognized as a basic ingredient for all kinds of baking needs. This wholesome product is especially appropriate to use both in doughs and fillings. Vacuum packed regular as well as wheat germ with sugar & honey can be used in baking.

The rich dough is a traditional Danish puff paste made with yeast and plenty of butter. The preparation method has been streamlined and simplified by the baking experts in Kretschmer consumer kitchens. Follow the directions for rolling and forming the dough. If you're a newcomer to working with this type of dough, allow enough time so you don't feel rushed. If you're experienced and work quickly, it may not be necessary to refrigerate the dough between rollings. Full details are given in the recipe directions.

WHEAT GERM KRINGLE

1 (.6 ounce) cake compressed yeast
2 tablespoons sugar
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
2 teaspoons cooking oil
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 to 1 3/4 cups flour
3/4 cup butter, slightly softened
Wheat Germ Filling
Egg Wash
Wheat Germ Topping
Crumble yeast into mixing bowl. Mix in sugar. Let stand until dissolved 3 to 5

minutes. Beat in egg then milk, oil and salt. Stir in just enough flour to form a soft dough. Beat butter until pliable but not soft (this consistency is important). Roll out dough on floured surface to about 12 x 9-inch rectangle. Spread butter lengthwise on center third of rectangle. Fold dough into thirds over butter, pressing edges together to seal. Place on baking sheet. Refrigerate ten minutes then roll out to 1/2-inch thickness. Repeat folding, refrigerating and rolling twice.* Cut dough in half crosswise. Stack halves and roll out to 1/4-inch thickness. Refrigerate at least 45 minutes or until firm.

*NOTE: If butter is right consistency and folding and rolling is done quickly, it may not be necessary to refrigerate dough between steps.

TO SHAPE AND BAKE KRINGLE

Divide dough in half lengthwise. Roll out each half into an 18 x 4-inch rectangle. Spoon half of the Wheat Germ Filling onto each rectangle, making a strip along center of dough. Fold long edges of dough over filling to almost cover it, leaving a slight gap. Transfer to greased baking sheet. Shape into modified pretzel. Brush with Egg Wash. Let rise in warm, draft free place, about 45 minutes until light and puffy. Sprinkle each kringle with Topping. Bake in 375 degree oven 18 to 20 minutes or until golden. Makes 2 kringles.

Wheat Germ Filling: Combine 1 cup Kretschmer regular wheat germ, 1/2 cup melted butter, 1/2 cup chopped walnuts, 1/2 cup golden seedless raisins, 1/2 cup brown sugar (packed), 1 egg and 1 teaspoon cinnamon.

Egg Wash: Beat 1 egg with 1 tablespoon water.

Wheat Germ Topping: Mix 1 tablespoon wheat germ with 1 tablespoon sugar.
