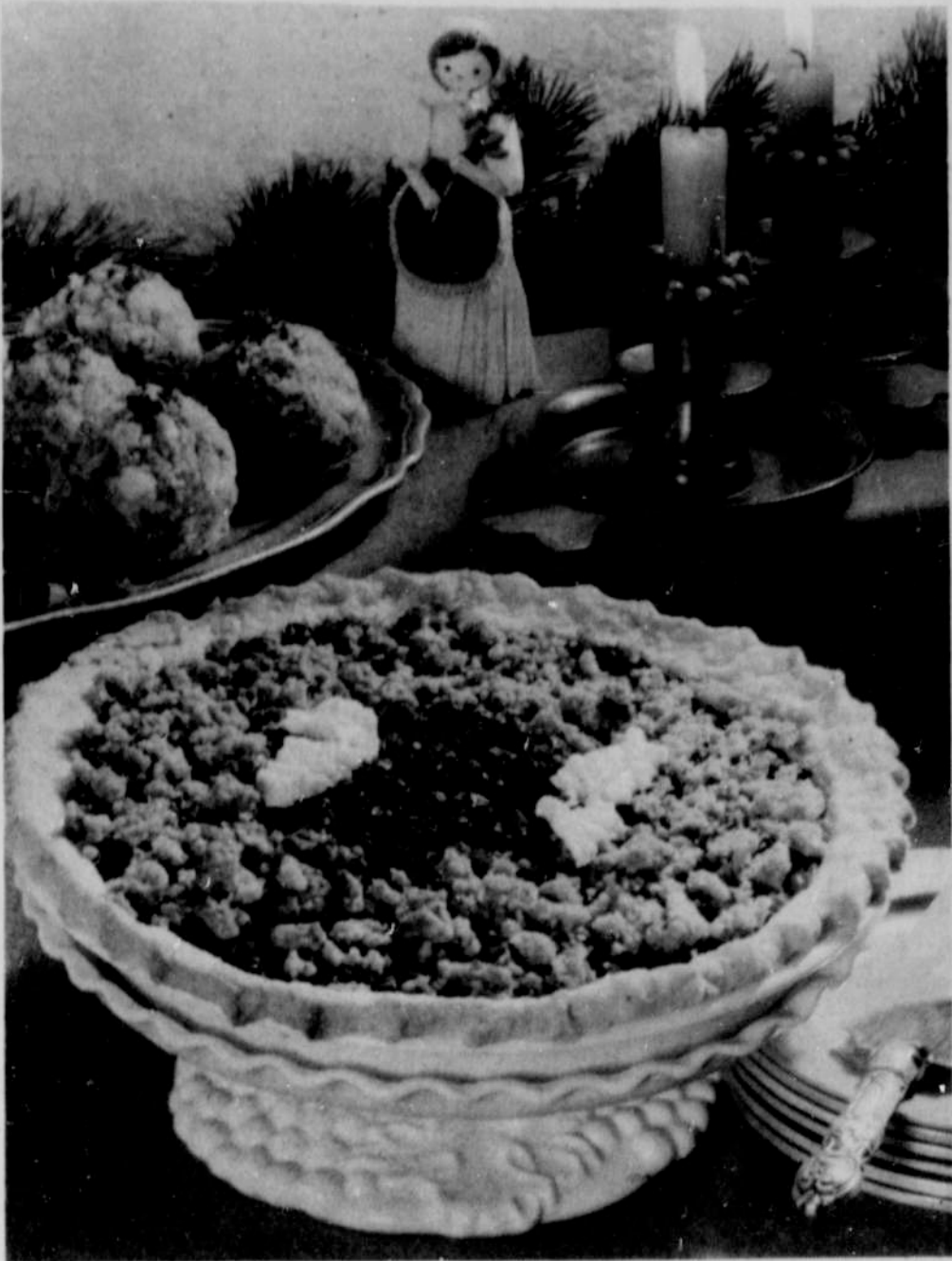




Sweet 'N Savory Wheat Germ Eloquence

Favorite holiday foods come and go. Two that go on year after year are fowl with stuffing and hot mincemeat pie. It's a mouthwatering thought just to anticipate their sweet and savory tastes.

Wheat germ has become the cooking school way of adding a basic natural newness to these oldtimers. In doing so wheat germ - the heart of the wheat kernels - brings an extra wallop of nutritious benefits. Check a jar of Kretschmer vacuum packed wheat germ to verify them. They are listed on the label.

After one taste, traditionalists agree that mincemeat pie is better than ever with these new wheat germ trimmings. It goes together easily. A simple, basic pastry crust, a ready made filling—all you do is stir in the wheat germ—and a crumbly streusel topping also made with wheat germ. This layer makes an interesting top crust for the sweet, spicy filling. The pie is delicious hot or cooled to room temperature. You'll find it takes beautifully to being garnished with hard sauce or served a la mode. These lavish touches are indeed festive although certainly not essential. The wheat germ streusel topping provides plenty of enhancement.

Almost everyone has a favorite stuffing for fowl. Stuffings go inside the bird cavity, are baked separately in a casserole or show off beautifully as stuffing balls. This marvelous corn bread stuffing has wheat germ and chestnuts adding to its elegance and great flavor. You can serve the stuffing balls with your choice of bird - cornish hens, tame or wild duck and turkey. Keep this wheat germ stuffing in mind too for the times you choose turkey parts and roast just the breast or legs. Whenever it's served, garnish the platter of wheat germ stuffing balls with a bit of greenery or a twist of bright pimiento.

Wheat Germ Chestnut Stuffing

- 1 (15-ounce) package corn bread mix
- Egg
- Milk
- 1/2 pound chestnuts
- 1 cup vacuum packed wheat germ (regular)
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 1/2 small onion, chopped
- 1 teaspoon oregano
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon thyme
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 beef bouillon cube
- 1 cup boiling water

Prepare corn bread mix with egg and milk as package directs. Bake and cool. Crumble. Make a slit in each chestnut with sharp knife. Cover with water. Boil gently 5 minutes.

Remove a few chestnuts with slotted spoon. Peel off outer shells and brown skins. Repeat with remaining chestnuts. Chop coarsely. Combine corn bread, chestnuts, wheat germ, melted butter, onion, oregano, salt, thyme and pepper. Dissolve bouillon cube in boiling water. Add to stuffing ingredients, mixing well. If desired add additional hot water to make stuffing more moist. Shape into 12 balls, about 1/2 cup each. Place in greased shallow pan. Bake in 325 deg. oven 25 minutes or until heated through. Makes 12 stuffing balls.

Wheat Germ Mincemeat Pie

- 1 (28-ounce) jar prepared mincemeat with brandy
- 1 cup vacuum packed wheat germ*
- 1 (9-inch) unbaked pastry shell
- 1/4 cup brown sugar (packed)
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 cup butter

*regular or sugar & honey
Mix mincemeat and 1/2 cup wheat germ. Turn into pastry shell. Mix remaining 1/2 cup wheat germ with brown sugar, flour and cinnamon. Cut in butter until soft and in large crumbs. Sprinkle over filling. Bake on lower rack in 400 deg. oven 25 to 30 minutes or until light golden brown. Makes 1 (9-inch) pie.
