A collection of arrowheads found by Jim Nicholson at Crump Lake in Warner Valley, Oregon is on display at Bob Thompson Agency. A total of some 120 arrowheads, spearheads and awls were found in about six hours of actual "hunting time," Nicholson reported, although he became interested when he moved from

Nyssa to Lakeview about a year and a half ago. Nicholson described the area as a lake bed where Indians came to hunt waterfowl, at periods dating back as far as 20,000 years. Last year water level was extremely low at the lake and erosion caused many new trophies to become exposed. The former Nyssan is visiting his parents here and expects to go to California the forepart of the year.
