Navy Seaman Apprentice William F. Spurgeon, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph H. Domenico of Route 2, Parma, Idaho, has departed for an extended deployment with the U. S. Seventh Fleet in the Western Pacific.

He is a crewmember aboard the frigate USS Rathburne, homeported in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

The missions of the Seventh Fleet are to protect U. S. citizens, shipping and interests in the Western Pacific; to deter aggression against our Western Pacific allies, by maintaining mobile striking forces; to promote peace and stability in the Western Pacific; and to create good will for the United States.

The Rathburne is scheduled to visit Yokosuka, Japan; and Subic Bay, Republic of Philippines during the deployment.
